- Each item chosen needs to contain/represent some history or a story about you things that that have contributed to the person you are now.
- Prepare what you are going to say. Don't stand up there thinking you will get away with showing your items and not explaining their importance (you may write notes and take them up with you)
- Put some thought into this! You don't need to bear your soul to everyone, just let us see a little bit of who you are!
